Mission Work in Many Areas

Missionaries

The primary purpose of the Chimala Mission is the saving of souls. The mission has numerous area churches where mature guidance is needed and appreciated. The opportunities are numerous: local outreach, strengthening local churches, mentoring, coordinating local campaigns, teaching in one or perhaps all preacher training schools. One school is in Swahili and the others are in English and are under the cooperative direction of the New York Avenue elders and the Bear Valley Bible Institute. Missionary wives have great opportunities to help develop and teach studies for the ladies and children.

American Doctors and Nurses

American doctors and nurses bring very important expertise to the 120 bed hospital. Local doctors and nurses will enjoy such opportunities to learn. American medical personnel will be respected and admired for the quality of skills they have developed. They will bring an increase of patients into the hospital due to their skills. Even the local staff will show a great loyalty to and appreciation for these workers. Many of the natives are treated by witch doctors who do them more harm than good. The work of skilled physicians and nurses goes a long way in opening the door for the gospel.

School Administration and Teachers

The Chimala Mission has a Primary School with over 500 students. The school is among the highest rated in the nation. The Secondary School started in 2010 and now has over 200 students in Form One and Two. The next two levels will be added in the next two years. All secondary schools in Tanzania are taught in English. An experienced English Teacher would be a tremendous asset. There are native school-masters over both the Primary and Secondary Schools. However a General School Administrator who could be over both schools would be wonderful. Every student studies Bible one hour a day and those living on campus attend services at the church on the mission grounds.

Facilities and Maintenance

The mission desires to be as self-sustaining as possible. This includes a wood shop, a metal shop and a mechanics building. There is a water system to be maintained. Electricity for the entire mission is supplied most of the time by the power company, but often by the mission's diesel generator. Several vehicles need to be kept running. In addition, there are approximately forty or more buildings to maintain. Cattle and farming operations are set for the near future.

Missionary-in-Charge

A Missionary-in-Charge is needed to help make sure things run smoothly and that the mission continues in the right spiritual direction. This missionary will work with all other supervisor personnel regarding budget, responsibilities, and quality of work. This position calls for someone who loves people, has a firm hand when needed, is sound in the faith, and really enjoys helping move the mission forward. This position also calls for contact with the Tanzanian government on all levels, local, regional, and national. This person will be the primary contact with the elders on a monthly basis via e-mail, Skype and telephone.

Special Projects

From time to time, the mission needs special projects. Recently a well was dug to provide fresh drinking water. Several buildings have been built to accommodate the growth of the two schools. The buildings need painting from time to time. Donated supplies are collected and shipped to the mission. The "Gospel Chariot" is used in the summer. Various groups from the states go over to help in many different ways.
