Chimala Bible Institute Report



The end of February began the first set of CBI short courses for the first quarter of 2016. **Ezekiel Harrison** was asked to teach Christian Ethics and I was asked to teach Christian Evidences. These are among my favorite topics to teach. I teach the first week and Ezekiel teaches the second week. I asked to teach the first week thinking that would allow me to finish the course just in time before our moving date to Ailsa. But, unfortunately, the mission house is still not ready to move in.

Naturally, soul-saving is at the center of all our efforts at the Chimala Mission. Sometimes people forget, but the overarching purpose of all the programs at the Chimala Mission (CBI, mission hospital, primary and secondary schools, etc.) is the salvation of souls through Jesus Christ our Lord. While CBI is the mission's preacher-training school, at the same time it has frequently been instrumental in the evangelistic successes of students and their families and friends. As a preaching school, all men recruits are assumed to be faithful Christians. But occasionally a student discovers through deeper study that his understanding of how to become a Christian was insufficient, or he may have been poorly or incorrectly taught.



Recently, four new recruits from **Mwanza** made it known that they needed to be baptized correctly—for the remission of their sins. They had been misled by the false teachings of missionaries in their home villages. When they and other potential recruits heard the pure gospel by some of our visiting instructors, they made known their desire to study at CBI. Consequently through the teachers' daily class lessons, lectures, and personal studies; the gospel truth shined forth brightly convicting and convincing their hearts. And even today, a man named, **Daniel**—a friend of one of our students who was visiting CBI—learned the same truth and was baptized into Christ just past 12 noon. We are always overjoyed to assist a soul in his or her journey to God.

MTAPA EVANGELISM REPORT

This report came in from Joseph Haonga, our director of the Swahili program:

“Greetings in the Name of our Mighty Lord, the following report is the report of evangelism campaign from March 4 – March 10 2016 conducted by students under the supervision of their respective teachers. The **Purpose of the Campaign** was to enable students from our preaching school to learn the importance, weight and responsibility of conducting Bible classes door to door in order to build a strong church. They conducted classes with non-believers, to restore the fallen away Christians and to encourage the live Christians to stay in faith. In all areas where the campaign was conducted results were magnificent, the following are the main features of the results.

Students proved themselves to God and to us that they have chosen the right path. They worked so diligently, encouraging one another to keep on working for the whole week. Every evening as they sat down to rest, they would remind each other of the significant verses, for example verses about baptism, repentance, one church and of the like subjects. The teachers would always intervene when a student would misuse a scripture by helping students understand better the proper usage of those scriptures. Well, it did not take long before most of the students were able to manage those frequently used scriptures. So to them it was a test and a class, they all got eager to spread leaders who at first proved to be barrier to the student. In the end not many denominational leaders could stand in the way of our students in those villages.

We had **nine (9) baptisms**, three of which occurred at night, where by people who had taught earlier that day and warned of the danger to delay taking action after hearing the gospel, decided to be baptized that night they woke up students who were by then a sleep but took pleasure in having their rest cut short in order to welcome new souls to the Lord.”




A Local Version of the "Gospel Chariot"

Hopeful plans for 2016

Much work has been performed in the last 3 years to improve the services at the hospital, however, there remains much more to do. The biggest deterrent for improvement is funding. The hospital stays in the "black" but not with enough funds for improvements. This is where we could really use your help. Below are the two priorities we would like to perform this year.



Solar power - The electricity is not dependable especially in the months of June - December during our dry season. This means we cannot perform x-rays, labs, surgeries, provide oxygen to those who need it or a host of other items. We need to have a reliable source of electricity in order to provide adequate care to those in need. If we can raise an additional **\$13,000** we can power the hospital with Solar Energy. Imagine the improvement that this will make.. Continuous uninterrupted power. This will be something that the mission hospital has never had.

Upgrade and remodel our X-ray department. This department is in great disrepair with old, breaking equipment. We would like to up-grade to a new machine with digital abilities and automatic processing. One great advantage of having digital equipment would allow us to reach out to more qualified Radiologist to help read some of the more complicated cases. We even have experts here in the states that have offered their services. This would be a huge help for our hospital. We have been trying to hire a new radiologist for a long time and there are so few in Tanzania it is difficult to get one to come to the “bush”.



New Equipment
Our laboratory has finally received some much needed equipment. We are now able to perform complete **chemistry and hematology panels.** These labs will assist in better diagnosing and treatment identification.
