While the "mission field" is technically as close as our next-door neighbor; mission work has traditionally been patterned after the New Testament example of men like Paul, Barnabas, John Mark, Silas, Luke and others as described in what is known from the book of Acts as "Paul's Missionary Journeys." These men traveled and worked in foreign and not-always-friendly places to preach the gospel of Christ. As John Mark quickly learned, leaving family behind to do the Lord's work in a strange land, culture and language is not something easy to do, and not many are willing to do it.

We may be familiar with names like William Carey and David Livingstone who pioneered the pattern of modern missionary work. But less familiar to the world but known among our brotherhood are the names of Eldred Echols, Guy Caskey, J.C. Choate, Andrew Connally, Otis Gatewood, J.C. Bailey, Edwin Crookshank, and many others. I encourage you to get a copy of Rod and Brenda Rutherford's excellent book, "Of Whom The World Was Not Worthy", to discover the lives and works of so many unsung heroes of the faith. And as I have stated before in the past, there have been countless Christian families and their children as well as single Christians who have literally given of themselves to serve and promote the Chimala Mission in it's 60-plus years of existence. We today are eternally grateful for their sacrifices small and great as well as all those who supported them.
