Bags of Good Works

As we enter the month of March, Mary and I have been home from Chimala for only a few days and are pretty tired, as expected after such a long trip. Before we left, with the help of the Wrights and Nathan's kids, Mary organized nearly 600 book bags with supplies to be distributed to the primary and secondary schools (CMPS & HCSS). These bags are some of the last we've been able to send over in previous container shipments. Moving forward, we have received the cooperation of the mission congregation (Chimala "B") to take over this longstanding work by making the bags themselves, with some financial assistance for supplies and materials. This is a step forward as we encourage local churches to become more involved in these types of good works. If your church was previously involved in making these bags or assisting with other efforts or donations, your help is still needed in the form of funds to help purchase a few inexpensive manual sewing machines and supplies. We need this work to continue!

Part of what makes the Chimala Mission a successful work is its great potential--and actual existence--as a self-sustaining effort. Visitors to the mission frequently comment on the beautiful hardwood furniture and wood trim that is found in the mission houses. The interesting thing is that most of this furniture was not shipped from the States, but instead was designed and crafted right on the mission from its native trees.

Before you cry out "Save the trees!", let me assure you we only make lumber from trees that have already fallen which helps preserve the natural mission forests. Using proper conservation saves the mission money, prevents rotting trees from becoming fire hazards, and provides the mission with useful lumber for regular mission needs.

The first Sunday of February, Mary and I, along with Menard Swila, visited one of the nearby churches in Mlangali. This is the congregation where brother Chando attends, one of the older gospel preachers who was trained at the old Ailsa mission many years ago. He and his wife live in a house just across the road. Upon our arrival, one of the first things that caught our eye was the partially built structure next to their old and dilapidated place of assembly. Time, rain, and termites have caused signficant damage to their current house of worship, leading them to begin the slow process of building a newer and safer place to meet.

With much sacrifice, they have already made significant progress on the new building. However, they could really use some help, as I don't think their current building will stand much longer.

I am a strong believer in helping those who are trying to help themselves. Because the brethren at Mlangali embody this attitude, I would like to recommend this church to you as a group of Christians worthy of your support. They will continue to sacrifice and build as they are able, but a goal of \$4,000 would put them in a position to transition to their new building. This is a church with a few men, but a majority of women and children. Their current building is on the verge of collapse. Please contact me if you are able to help.
